### **GAD-7 What is it? Brief Description**

When considering a diagnosis, the clinician will still need to use clinical interviewing skills to determine whether the symptoms are causing clinically significant distress or impairment and those symptoms are not better explained or attributed to other conditions (ie substance use, medical conditions, bereavement, etc)
